A unique fresh tissue cadaveric dissection course to be held at Glasgow University, 22nd – 23rd March 2012. The course will appeal to trainees and consultants in plastic surgery, ENT, and ophthalmology who have an interest in the surgery of facial paralysis. A national faculty of experts will demonstrate current techniques with 2 candidates to each cadaver, including:

Endoscopic forehead and brow lift

Insertion of gold weight and canthoplasty techniques

Nerve grafting, including nerve harvest and exposure of facial nerve

Static support techniques of the midface including fascia lata slings and face-lift techniques

Facial nerve to hypoglossal nerve anastomosis

This unique course allows a maximum hands-on experience involving instruction in current techniques of surgery in facial paralysis using fresh tissues.
